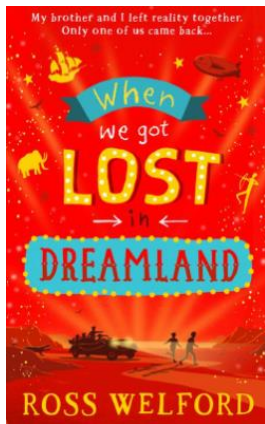
## World Book Day

### School Uniform reminder

Our official stockist of school uniform is Identity Kits of Wells, 23 Broad Street, Wells. However, some items can be obtained from any large retailer. Poppy Brake also has 2<sup>nd</sup> hand uniform available for a small donation to the PTA.

Our school uniform consists of:

- Trousers, skirts, pinafore dresses or shorts - grey or black. (Children should not be wearing leggings or tracksuit bottoms)
- Polo shirts - navy with school logo
- Sweatshirts in bottle green with school logo or green cardigans.
- Green gingham check summer dresses.
- Shoes should be black 'school shoes' - not trainers or ballet pumps.
- PE kit consisting of black shorts, jogging bottoms or leggings and black t-shirt with school logo (see below re: colour of logo), together with black daps or trainers
- There is also a sport hooded jumper in bottle green for PE only.
